 of Georgia, formerly of the state of South Caroli-  
 na, & formerly William Ed Haskell Jr. in  
 consideration of the sum of Five (\$5.00)  
 and other good and valuable considera-  
 tion not herein mentioned to me in  
 hand paid at and before the sealing  
 of these presents by George A. Bissell of the  
 City of Charleston in the State of South Caro-  
 lina, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl-  
 edged, have granted, bargained, sold and  
 released and by these presents do grant  
 bargain, sell and release unto the  
 said George A. Bissell his heirs and assigns  
 All that plantation or tract of land situated  
 lying and being on the west side of the Pon Pon  
 River, Pon Pon Neck, in the old Parish of  
 St. Bartholomew in Colleton County and State  
 aforesaid, known as 'Pringle Field' contain-  
 ing Three hundred (300) acres, more or less,  
 of which about one hundred and twenty-  
 three (123) acres are cleared rice land, and  
 having such boundaries, shape, forms, div-  
 visions and dimensions as are delineated  
 on a plat made by Charles Parker, Surveyor  
 about January 1829, Copied from a survey taken  
 by Charles Vignoles in January and dated 1<sup>st</sup> February  
 1820, less the portion conveyed by W. D. Clancy  
 Master to Alexander G. Rice on or about -  
 day of - 1887.

Also, All that other plantation or tract



of land situate on the West side of Can-Pon River  
 Can-Pon Neck, in the old Parish of St. Bartholomew,  
 in Colleton County, and State of aforesaid, adjoining  
 the aforesaid "Pringle Field" being a part  
 the Newton Tract, and that part or portion thereof  
 which was allotted to Mrs Susan Cleary under  
 proceedings for partition of her father's (Gen. McPherson)  
 Estate, about the year 1829, containing about  
 one hundred and fifty-five & half (155-1/2) acres  
 of high land and two hundred and forty one  
 and a half (241-1/2) acres of cleared rice land,  
 more or less, and having such shape, form,  
 boundaries, divisions and dimensions as

 tation on Can-Pon River in the County  
 of Colleton, State of South Carolina, as  
 follows to wit, that portion of river swam-  
 ps designated by the Numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 on  
 a plat of the lands of Gen. John McPherson  
 copied by Charles Parker from a survey taken  
 by Charles Vignoles in January and dated  
 1st February 1820, and said to contain  
 about forty-four and forty seven hun-  
 dredths (44-47/100) acres, more or less, of rice  
 land and that portion of the high land  
 adjoining the aforesaid portion of the  
 river swamps and extending Westwardly  
 up to the public road leading to Jackson  
 boro and that portion of the block swamps  
 lying Southwardly of the red dotted line  
 appearing on said Plat, or running  
 from a point marked Bay H 3 Eastwardly  
 across said back swamp N. 70° East which  
 includes about twenty-six and sixty-six
